

UNASL Organizes Successful Eye Camp in Pannala







The United Nations Association of Sri Lanka (UNASL) successfully conducted a special eye clinic at the Pannala Galayaya Rajamaha Viharaya on Sunday, June 15, 2025, providing vital eye care services to the local community.

The initiative was spearheaded by Dr. Chrishantha Dissanayake, Assistant Secretary-General of the United Nations Association of Sri Lanka, and offered comprehensive range of services, including eye examinations, distribution of free eyeglasses, referrals for further medical treatment, and recommendations for free intraocular lenses. A total of 120 individuals from villages surrounding the Galayaya Rajamaha Viharaya in the Pannala Divisional Secretariat benefited from the clinic. Of those examined, 18 received complimentary eye glasses, 15 were referred for medical treatment for conditions such as cataracts and other eye diseases, and 10 were recommended for free eye lens implants.

Farming in the Face of Climate Change

Climate change is no longer a distant threat it is a daily reality for farmers across Sri Lanka. Agriculture, the backbone of livelihoods and food security, is now increasingly vulnerable to erratic weather patterns. The oncepredictable Yala and Maha seasons have become unreliable, turning farming into a risky endeavor. A recent study by the Centre for Environmental Justice (CEJ) identified Mannar and Monaragala as two of the most climate vulnerable districts in the country. In these regions, communities that have long relied on traditional farming practices are grappling with the harsh new realities of prolonged droughts, sudden floods, and shrinking cultivation windows. In Mannar's Manthai West division, CEJ selected three highly vulnerable communities Kayanagar, Koorai, and Seethuvinayagar Kulam for a special climate adaptation project. Conditions in Seethuvinayagar Kulam are particularly severe. The community lacks even basic infrastructure, and farmers depend entirely on agriculture for their survival. With no reliable water sources or transport facilities, they are wholly at the mercy of the natural climate. They farm only during the rainy season, while the rest of the year is marked by struggle and uncertainty.

Heavy rains frequently flood the village, blocking roads and cutting off access, making daily life incredibly difficult. In response, CEJ launched a pilot project aimed at strengthening these communities' resilience to climate change. Through awareness programs and specialized training, farmers were introduced to climate change mitigation techniques and adaptation strategies. The project implemented solar-powered water irrigation systems, renovated existing water storage tanks, and established model farms showcasing climate-resilient agricultural practices. Farmers were trained in regenerative agriculture methods, such as crop rotation, organic composting, and water efficient farming, helping to restore soil health, conserve water, and increase biodiversity.

Recognizing the urgent need for broader transformation, CEJ's efforts extend beyond local interventions. Their programs also emphasize Good Practices (GAP) and Agricultural sustainable farming techniques that can not only boost productivity but also safeguard the environment. Yet, the fight against climate change cannot rely on community action alone.

Comprehensive policy reforms are urgently needed to promote climate-resilient agriculture, improve market access for farmers, and provide financial support to those impacted by climate disasters. Environmental degradation, including illegal sand mining and deforestation, further exacerbates the crisis by accelerating soil erosion and disrupting vital ecosystems. Protecting natural resources must go hand in hand with adapting agricultural methods.

Despite these immense challenges, the resilience of farmers in Mannar and Monaragala offers hope. With the right blend of knowledge, technology, and policy support, they can continue to thrive. But their success hinges on collective action strong government leadership, active community participation, and greater awareness among consumers and stakeholders.

As climate change continues to reshape our world, the time to act is now. Supporting climate-smart farming practices, investing in sustainable research, and enforcing policies that protect both farmers and the environment are essential steps forward. Together, we can secure a sustainable future for Sri Lanka's farmers and ensure food security for generations to come.

Key Focus:


Raising awareness about the past, present, and future of quantum science and technology.
